2.	<p>AGE LIMIT: Candidates should have completed the age of Seventeen years on or before 31st December 2023. Evidence for the age (e.g., Birth Certificate, 10th Mark Sheet, +2 Mark sheet, etc.) should be produced.</p>
3.	<p>EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS:</p>
i.	<p>Candidates should have passed in all the subjects of the qualifying examination of the Higher Secondary Certificate Examination conducted by the Tamil Nadu State Board or any other equivalent Board in the following group of subjects along with English individually.</p> <p>(a) Physics, Chemistry, Botany and Zoology. (or) (b) Physics, Chemistry, Biology with any other subject.</p> <p>Note: Candidates who have passed in other board of examination (i.e., other than the Tamil Nadu State Board, CBSE and ICS) with same subjects as mentioned above in Clause 3 should produce the Eligibility Certificate from The Tamil Nadu Dr. MGR Medical University before attending the Counselling.</p>

d.	<p>Determination of Rank of Candidates Obtaining Equal Marks (Inter Se Merit):</p> <p>In cases, where two or more candidates obtain equal aggregated marks for 200, the rank of such candidates shall be determined on the basis of the following order, namely: -</p> <p>(i) Percentage in Biology or Botany and Zoology taken together in qualifying examination.</p> <p>(ii) Percentage in Chemistry in qualifying examination.</p> <p>(iii) Percentage in fourth optional subject in qualifying examination.</p> <p>(iv) Date of Birth- Weightage given to seniority in age</p> <p>(v) Computerized Random number assigned. Higher value of Random Number will be taken into Consideration.</p>
10.	The merit list will be published on the notice board at the office of the Selection Committee and will be posted simultaneously on the website: www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in
11.	The selection will be made by counselling based on the merit only.
12.	All selections and admissions to BNYS course are only provisional. The selection and admission are liable to be cancelled at any time as and when the eligibility conditions are found to be defective or incorrect or of any suppression of facts deliberately or otherwise. The right of allotment to BNYS Course and College is vested totally with the Selection Committee.
13.	<p>COUNSELLING:</p> <p>Selection of candidates will be done through counselling based on the merit.</p>

i.	<p>a) Selection committee is the designated authority for counselling for admissions to BNYS course in all Government and Self-Financing Yoga and Naturopathy Medical Colleges in Tamil Nadu.</p> <p>b) No authority or institution shall admit any candidate to the undergraduate course in contravention of the criteria or procedure as laid down by Selection committee in respect of admissions and any candidate admitted in contravention of the said criteria or procedure shall be discharged.</p>
ii.	<p>Counselling Schedule will be made available on the website (www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in). Candidates can attend the counselling session based on their merit.</p>
iii.	<p>a) All Communication regarding Counselling will be displayed / available through the official website only and any change or modification and relevant information pertaining to this admission process will be made available on the website www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in</p>
	<p>b) The candidates are instructed to visit the website at least two times a day for updates from the date of issue of application till the end of admission process without fail. Selection Committee will not be responsible for consequences resulting due to non-diligent follow-up of notices, notification and publications appearing on the website regarding admission to B.N.Y.S. Course 2023-2024 Session.</p>
	<p>c) Candidates should attend the Counselling session as per the Schedule and as per their rank mentioned in official website: www.tnhealth.tn.gov.in .</p>
iv.	<p>One of the Parents or Guardian will be allowed to accompany the candidate to attend the counselling and they should make their own arrangements for attending the counselling session.</p>
v.	<p>Selection will be made by counselling based on merit. Candidates can select a college of their own choice at the time of counseling. However, the allotment is subject to availability of the seats. Option once exercised during counselling, will be final and cannot be changed.</p>

vi.	Those who get Re-totaled / revalued marks during the first appearance can also attend the counselling on the day and session according to their new marks. If the candidate produces the Re-totaled / revalued marks after the counselling and within the cutoff date then his/her name, will be considered only in the existing vacancies available and he/she cannot claim any preferential rights for allotment according to merit under re-totaled / revalued marks. Candidates, who submit the Revalued / Re-totaled marks after the administrative cut-off dates fixed by the Ministry of AYUSH, New Delhi, / the Tamil Nadu Dr.M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai, will not be considered for selection.
vii.	The vacancies arising after the first phase of counselling will be filled up from the waiting list through counselling.
viii.	Counselling / Allotment for the seats newly created due to provision of seat matrix after the commencement of first phase counselling by the Tamil Nadu Dr. MGR Medical University or due to the orders / interim orders passed / issued by the Honorable High Court after the commencement of 1st phase counselling will be done during the 2nd phase counselling but within the cutoff date as laid down by the Affiliating Body, The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University / Govt. of Tamil Nadu.
ix.	Re-allotment will be available only for those who have joined the college within the stipulated time.
x.	Re-allotment for the vacancies arising due to not joining of the candidates will be done on merit basis subject to the availability of sufficient time before the cut-off date as prescribed by the Ministry of AYUSH, New Delhi / the Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai.
xi.	Re-allotment is not a matter of right of the candidate. Re-allotment will be done only through counselling on merit basis, if vacancies are available. If sufficient time is not available, vacancies will be filled up with the candidates from the waiting list on merit basis only.
xii.	Selection Committee reserves the rights of movement of candidate from one college to another college based on merit. If a candidate gives option to stay in the previously allotted college, he/she is allowed to opt out of the movement procedure by giving a declaration for the same and they will not be considered for change of college at a later date.

Note:

1. Candidates who fails to attend the Counselling schedule stipulated to them, as per their turn, for whatsoever reasons, will be given a seat in the existing vacancies available in any one of the colleges irrespective of their merit of marks, within the same phase of Counselling.
2. Candidates getting allotment through court orders before the cutoff date will be given a seat in the existing vacancies under management quota available at the time of counseling when he/she actually attends.
3. Candidates who fail to attend the counselling at the specified date and time will forfeit their right to admission and their names will not be considered at later phase of Counselling. However, he/she can authorize his/her parent on his/her behalf for that phase of counseling due to any unavoidable circumstances. The parents' decision will be binding on the candidate. An authorization letter given by the candidate should be submitted by the parents along with the original documents of any one of the identification proofs such as Voter ID, driving license, Pan Card, Passport, Aadhar card, etc. of both the parent and the candidate as mentioned in the annexure II and II (A). Due to unforeseen and unavoidable circumstances, if a candidate, his/her parents/guardian could not attend the counseling on the specified date and time, the candidate will be permitted to attend the counseling on the subsequent date in the same phase of counseling and he/she can only opt for the seats available at the time of counseling and cannot claim seat as per his/her rank.
4. Those who do not join within the stipulated time to the particular college to which they are allotted, will not be considered for admission at any point of time later under management quota.
5. No candidate can opt to be waitlisted for a particular college when seats are available in other colleges at his/ her turn.
6. If a candidate opts out of (not willing to take) when seats are available at the time of his / her counselling, then he/she will not be eligible for the same seat at any point of time later for whatsoever reason.
7. Individual request for transfer of college will not be entertained after allotment of seat is made.
8. Mutual transfers will not be entertained under any circumstances.

2. Upon passing the final B.N.Y.S. Examination the candidate shall serve as “Intern” for the prescribed period as laid down by The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai.
3. (i) The candidate shall on demand made by the Government within two years from the date on which he/she registers himself/herself as a Medical Practitioner, serve for a period of not less than five years and in such rural areas as the Government may by general or special orders specify.

(ii) Those candidates who fail to comply with clause 3 (i) shall have to pay a sum of Rs 3,00,000/- (Rupees Three Lakhs only) or as the Government may direct as penalty for having breached the contract in the bond.

4. During the period of Internship under clause (2) and while in service under clause (3) the candidate shall faithfully, diligently and with skill and ability perform his/her duties and observe the rules for the time being in force made by the Governor or the President as the case may be for regulating the conduct of Government Servants.
5. While in service under clause (3) the Pay and allowance and other conditions of service of the candidate shall be regulated by the rules and orders of the Government for the time being in force, for the posts to which he/she is appointed.

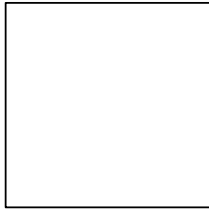

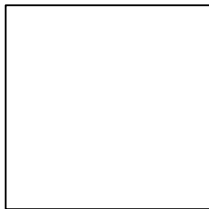
